





This course will address the Virginia Standards of Learning for Grade 11 English and introduce students to critical thinking and the fundamentals of academic writing. Through the writing process, students will refine topics; develop and support ideas; investigate, evaluate, and incorporate appropriate resources; edit for effective style and usage; and determine appropriate approaches for a variety of contexts, audiences, and purposes. Writing activities will include exposition and argumentation with at least one researched essay that requires students to locate, evaluate, integrate, and document sources and effectively edit for style and usage.

This course is part of the Advanced Placement Program of the College Entrance Examination Board that makes. demands on students equivalent to those of an introductory college course. In AP World History: Modern, students investigate significant events, individuals, developments, and processes from 1200 to the present. Students develop and use the same skills, practices, and methods employed by historians; analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical connections; and utilizing reasoning about comparison, causation, and continuity and change over time. The course provides six themes that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places; humans and the environment, cultural developments and interactions, governance, economic systems, social interactions and organization, and technology and innovation. The Advanced Placement syllabus gives a complete course description.

Secondary parents must continue to access ParentVUE to see official grades for all assignments and grade totals*

In Canvas, parents and guardians function as Observers. This means you have limited permissions that allow you to see what is going on in a course without participating in the course or viewing the work or interactions of students for whom you are not the guardian.

Parent observers can view their student's courses in Canvas after the teacher has published the course. Observers cannot submit work on behalf of the students they observe.

Parents may create a Canvas Parent Observer account and access Canvas via a web browser or the Parent app. It is not required for parents to create a Canvas account. However, with an account, you are 'co-enrolled' in a course as an Observer and can monitor your students' progress.

The district recommends using the web browser to log in as a Parent Observer because it provides the best experience and the most functionality for a parent.





High School Credit Recovery (Grades 9-12)

Overview: Provides eligible students the opportunity to recover credits towards fulfilling graduation requirements. This is a four-week program, in-person for 4.5 hours per day.

Dates: July 8, 2024 - August 2, 2024

Location: Yorktown High School

Times: 7:45 am - 12:15 pm

Eligibility: Eligibility is based on credit recovery needs. High school students who failed a course required for graduation are eligible to attend Summer School.

Virtual and Blended Courses offered in APS Summer School (July 8 - August 2nd)

Students taking blended courses are required to report to Yorktown High School for the inperson portion of the class. The courses below are led by APS teachers.
